

SUMPORT: Sustainable Urban Mobility in MED port cities

The project SUMPORT – Sustainable Urban Mobility in MED port cities – is co-financed by the Interreg MED Programme and aims at supporting the uptake of Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans (SUMPs) in MED port cities and at implementing them at local level through several pilot actions, such as new bike lanes, e-bike sharing, car pooling and innovative IT applications for public transport.

The project SUMPORT focuses on increasing the planning capacities on sustainable mobility of port cities through training activities and exchange of experiences. As a result, participating port cities will draft or update their own Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans (SUMPs).

Port cities will also implement and simulate pilot actions for testing various types of measures (e.g. bicycle lanes, bike sharing system, carpooling, ICT application for public transport) concerning sustainable mobility with a tangible impact on citizens' everyday life.

The pilot action of the Region of Epirus/ Regional Unit of Thesprotia, which participates as a project partner, refers to a bike sharing system for the promotion of shared mobility and the reduction of motorized traffic.

The project started on 1 February 2017 and will run until 31 July 2019. It has a total budget of almost 2.358.759,20 EUR.
